

AS IT UNFOLDS IN THE COUNTRY

Poachers Cottage, Robin Woodhead and his husband Christian's home in the country, is a refuge from the bustle of the London art world. Nestled into a hillside which overlooks a glorious Dorset valley, it is a very special place, almost literary, as if sprung from the pages of E.M. Forster's 'Howards End'. Gardens wrap around the home like a fragrant blanket. With never-ending views of hill and sky, the house is outside-in as windows and doors frame the dazzling countryside.

Inside, comfortable rooms unfold, lived-in and loved, with objects and pictures placed as if they have been together forever. There are clever surprises at every turn: windowsills are shelves for striking ceramics, the green glazes of Chinese pots capture reflections from light against a backdrop of verdant leaves; an 18th-century 'Country' oak desk sits upon a Moroccan rug laid across an English stone floor in an alcove lined with books.

Upstairs there are shifts in tone: wonderful photographs, grey, black and white, contrast with the pen and ink of old master drawings hung against a steely blue-green ground; an elegant guest room, lined with trompe-l'oeil-painted walls, hosts comfortable furniture and a beautifully figured Colonial wardrobe. The kitchen, which rises-up through the house with its high vaulted ceiling, has wonderful

vignettes too. There are objects drawn from distant places: an Orkadian crofters chair sits beside a fireplace which is surmounted by an African mask; an Italian old master painting and a Spanish 17th-century walnut trestle table share their own recessed space, which feels like an altar, whilst opposite, Grayson Perry's 'Map of An Englishman' holds court above a solid Georgian mahogany table which in turn hosts a drinks tray.

Layers of life abound as the fine and decorative arts in the collection share a considered sensibility, each layer revealing a life spent discovering places, people, history and art. Objects and images are exquisitely drawn together whilst colours are soft, often monochromatic, allowing the photography to sing. Texture comes from the glazes of ceramics, the lustre of rich timbers and the tactility of fine textiles.

The following photographs capture the magical backdrop of Poachers. The subtle combination of objects and disciplines across time periods and locations near and far recalls some of Sotheby's greatest auctions, from David Sylvester's townhouse to Stanley Seeger's cottage in the countryside. We have no doubt that this collection will inspire new generations of collectors to bring together objects in a unique and thoughtful way.


