JANUARY 2021



January's historic sales in New York defied the repercussions of the pandemic, setting two auction records for Italian sculptors. A rare glazed terracotta relief by the founder of the Della Robbia dynasty, Luca the Elder, more than doubled its pre-sale estimate, fetching \$2 million in the Masters Week Evening Sale. Leading the singular collection of Hester Diamond was a masterpiece of the Baroque, the marble *Autumn* by Pietro and Gian Lorenzo Bernini, which sold for \$8.8 million. The same sale obtained outstanding results for Late Gothic wood sculpture, notably a life-size *Anna Selbdritt* by the Master of the Schongauer Altärchen. Masters Week in New York also featured a dedicated sale of Sculpture & Works of Art, which included important private collections and achieved a total result of \$2.75 million.

JUNE & NOVEMBER 2021



The sale of an exceptional collection of French Baroque bronzes in June confirmed Sotheby's Paris as the market leader in this field. With a final result of over €1.5 million, a superb cast of Michel Anguier's Neptune soared past its estimate to achieve a record price, followed by versions of Anguier's Pluto and L'Air by Etienne Le Hongre, which sold for €799,000 and €617,500 respectively. Further notable highlights from a busy year in Paris included a pair of important 18th-century marble vases, which sold for €460,200 in June, as well as sculpture sold in distinguished single owner auctions. such as those of Pierre Le-Tan in March and the Princesse de Salm in October.

JULY & DECEMBER 2021



London's sales of *Old Master Sculpture & Works of Art* adapted to an online format with strong results throughout 2021. The year also saw the London department pioneer two successful auctions in collaboration with Tomasso, as well as participating in the *Treasures* sales, whose July edition included a bronze *Apollo and Python* which sold for £252,000. Focusing on the growing market for early jewels and glyptics, the new category of *Small Wonders*, introduced in 2020, brought a record price for a Renaissance intaglio with the sale of the *Arundel Zodiac* in July, which fetched £559,500 against an estimate of £120,000-180,000. The *19th & 20th Century Sculpture* market continues to be driven by an international demand for Romantic marbles, as exemplified by the exquisite *Reading Girl* by Antonio Rossetti sold in July.
